<p>CFAG19/07 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE & DECLARATION OF INTERESTS</p> <p>Apologies of absence were noted from Prof Rob Atenstaedt, Ms Beryl Roberts, Mr Ian Fearn, Ms Gail Critchley, Ms Ffion Johnstone, Ms Keeley Twigg, Ms Eryl Gilliland, Ms Frances Vernon and Mr Wyn Thomas.</p>	
<p>CFAG19/08 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING HELD ON 31st JANUARY 2019</p> <p>Ms Hughes took this opportunity at the beginning of the meeting to inform the group of the current balance of the General funds, which as present stood at -£114,035.97. This was due to a fall in some of the investments, which resulted in the fund falling into deficit. The investments have improved at the beginning of quarter 4 and there was an increase of £381,000 at the end of February.</p> <p>Ms Hughes informed the group that she would bring the up-to-date balance to the next Charitable Funds meeting in May. It is hoped the March investment report will show a further increase resulting in General Funds being in a positive balance. However, the administration and fundraising costs of the charity for 2019/20 will need to come from General Funds and this will negatively affect the balance. Ms Hughes will bring the 2019/20 budget to the next meeting for the group's information.</p> <p>This discussion was just a reminder of how limited the General Funds are, and for the group to be mindful when making decisions on approving applications from General Funds.</p>	<p>RH</p> <p>RH</p>

<p>Ms Hoyle was aware that the Awyr Las Fundraising Team were paid from the General Funds and asked if they have targets to reach within their role.</p> <p>Ms Hughes informed the group that the fundraisers will have KPI's (Key Performance Indicators) to achieve but they are still being written. A copy will be submitted to the meeting once they are approved.</p> <p>Ms Hoyle asked the Group if the funding issue for the ENT Equipment application that was approved in principle at the January meeting had been resolved. Ms Clayton informed the Group that there was still a shortfall in funding for £33k, and it was agreed that the application should go back to the Cancer Centre Committee for them to consider funding. It was also recommended that the ENT Department should consider fundraising in the future to fund future applications.</p> <p>CFAG19/08.01 Accuracy</p> <p>Ms R Hughes gave an overview of the actions from the previous meeting and informed the group that all actions were closed apart from one action: North Wales Public Access Defibrillator Support Officer. The issue around the contract of employment was still ongoing. Ms Sellar will take this forward with the Lead Applicant and report to the Group in May.</p>	<p>RH</p> <p>PC</p> <p>ELJ</p> <p>TS</p>
<p>CFAG19/09 REQUEST FOR EXPENDITURE APPROVALS</p> <p>CFAG19/09.1 Filing Storage Cabinets - £6,897.60 YG</p> <p>Ms Hughes gave a brief overview of the application, which is for alternative storage for medical records due to the confidential nature of the information held. The Sexual Health service has a separate filing system to the rest of the hospital and medical records are stored within the department.</p> <p>They do have sufficient funds for this application but do not wish to use them for this purpose. Ms Clayton did suggest that they contribute towards the purchase. Their funds are to be used for staff development.</p> <p>The group agreed that the department should be using their own funds and would support the application if this was the case, but would not support from General Funds.</p> <p>Outcome – Not Approved from General Funds – Application approved from Department Fund.</p> <p>CFAG19/09.2 Diathermy Machine for Orthopaedic Surgeon in Hossanna £7,250.00</p> <p>Ms Hughes gave a brief outline of the bid, explaining that two reconditioned machines had been previously funded. This application is for a new machine which is based on advice from the surgeon who has worked in Africa. This new machine would be more robust, straightforward to use and likely to have a longer working life.</p>	<p>PC</p>

Ms Clayton informed the group that since the application was received Dr Cameron may have sourced a cheaper model. Ms Clayton will update the group.

Ms Clayton informed the group that this was a last minute application, but assured the group that all outstanding approvals would be sought.

The group felt that this was good use of their funds.

CFAG19/09.3 Video Conferencing and Presentation System - £7,455.60

Ms Hughes presented the bid, which would be to provide a replacement Video Conferencing Presentation system as their current system is broken and beyond repair. The cost of the equipment is to be apportioned over 3 departmental funds.

Ms Sellar agreed that the purchase of this equipment would be a cost saving due to the teaching sessions being presented over the system and saving travel time.

Ms Hoyle stated that they are using their own funds and it is to benefit the staff.

Ms Clayton informed the group that IM&T approval has been received since the circulation of the meeting papers.

Outcome – Approved, pending approval from Area Director

CFAG19/09.4 Implementation of A Sustainable Educational Session to Primary Schools within Central Area on Antimicrobial Stewardship using NICE Accredited EBug Resources - £12,442.50

Ms Hughes informed the group that the aim of this application is to deliver sustainable educational lesson plans on the importance of antimicrobial stewardship to Year 5&6 pupils in Primary Schools within Conwy and Denbighshire using NICE accredited Ebug education resources via a 'train the teacher' approach.

Ms Hoyle enquired whether this was an issue for Public Health Wales and not NHS. Mrs Joannou explained that she had mixed feelings about this application but there were wider long term benefits for children. She thought the costs were excessive and costs saving could be made by contacting the Local Education Authority and using staff inset training days to do the training and using the school nurse resource.

The group decided not to fund this application but would be willing to help them source alternative funding.

Outcome – Not Approved.

<p>CFAG19/09.5 Exploring Healthcare Professionals perspectives on Advanced Care Planning: Another Piece of the Puzzle - £23,993.00</p> <p>Ms Hughes presented this application. This is a Palliative Care research project on advance care planning it is a patient-led process of structured discussions between person/patient and their healthcare professionals. The discussions are aimed at eliciting and clarifying wishes and preferences of the patient for future care.</p> <p>There is currently not much research evidence and this is one element of a 3 pronged project, funding a research post for 11 months. This would be a stand-alone study which will be carried out by a non-BCU employee.</p> <p>Ms Hoyle expressed that she found it hard to understand the objectives but was happy for them to use their own funds.</p> <p>Mrs Joannou and Ms Sellar felt that the purpose of the application would be beneficial to the service in the long term and that the costs were reasonable.</p> <p>The group agreed that this was good use of their funds.</p> <p>Outcome – Approved, pending approval from Area Director and Chief Financial Officer.</p>

<p>In order to encourage cancer patients to actively manage their health and wellbeing whilst under treatment we are requesting funding to provide 5 TV screens in all outpatient and day unit reception areas. <p>The Karen Keating fund provided a donation of £10,000 a number of years previously in respect of upgrading the bathroom on Enfys into a wet room. Work on this project had stalled due to a variety of reasons outside of our control, however a design is now underway to prepare for tendering by Mott Macdonald the approved design agency for the Health Board. The cost of design, specification and tender documentation is £5,983.98 excluding VAT, which will be available by May 2019. Following a site visit, the bathroom requires a total re-configure and does not confirm with current legislation and will need to be extended. Until tendering has been undertaken, we are only able to provide estimate cost of reconfiguration at this stage. However, to not delay the work and to allow the tendering process to proceed we are requesting that funds are ring fenced to allow this work to be undertaken which is in addition to the £10,000 contribution received due to the costs of the design.</p>		



A further donation of £13,000 has been received by H Richards, Ruthin Choir and the fundraisers have requested that the funds go direct to supporting the wet room on Enfys.

By upgrading the bathroom it will comply with current DDA legislation and provide ease of use for disabled patients who struggled to use the current facilities. It will also reduce the number of trips and falls experienced by patients when using the bathrooms.

The need for this post was to ensure an individual who co-ordinated all care for the patient from the time of referral to the lung cancer service. This includes communication with the patient about further investigations, organising investigations and out patient appointments and sign posting them for further steps in the diagnostic pathway. The individual has also been assisting the lung cancer specialist nurses with administrative tasks such as completing health care needs assessments etc. This has essentially led to the nurses having more time to provide direct patient contact and undertake specific nurse led clinics. The pathway co-ordinator is also responsible for ongoing audit of the service, and takes part in service 		



improvement activities.

- This practice is in line with the current national recommendations stated in the 'National Optimal Lung Cancer Pathway', endorsed by the Welsh Cancer Network.
- The role has demonstrated immense benefit on many aspects. Over 10% of USC referrals now are discharged following a normal CT scan without a need to attend an outpatient clinic, which was the practice previously. The time to first attendance at an outpatient clinic and ultimately to start of treatment has reduced. A shorter time spent in the diagnostic pathway has been proven to improve survival.
- Recent formal feedback exercise carried out shows a positive overview of the new diagnostic process from our primary care colleagues

- Current stack system can only perform limited procedures (bladder washouts, JJ stents and flexible cystoscopy guided urethral catheter insertion) and is not capable of performing therapeutic treatments such as bladder biopsies and cystodiathermy.
- This provides compromised and limited vision of possible pathology in the bladder, resulting in patients being booked in for rigid cystoscopies and biopsies requiring general anaesthetic (GA).
- There is also a risk that that actual pathology within the bladder may be missed due to limited clarity.
- In cases where there is suspicion of a sinister lesion a photograph is taken so that the next procedure under GA can be planned appropriately. A high definition image will allow the surgeon to plan the list effectively as smaller lesions will require less time and larger lesions requiring more time. As it is now, photographs sometimes cannot be taken as the function is not always working and even when it does work, the pictures taken are of poor quality.
- Lesions that are suspicious, no matter how tiny, are booked for a GA cystoscopy and biopsy, cystodiathermy or transurethral resection of bladder tumour. The waiting times for a GA procedure are often many months and in fact, many breach the recommended times. This is not only unsafe for patients as smaller non-invasive lesions may progress to invasive lesions but these procedures are also added to the long waiting list of patients awaiting GA procedures and add to the anxiety of patients who may have a possible diagnosis of cancer. These problems could be avoided if therapeutic treatments such as biopsy or cystodiathermy can be done under LA in the UDU.
- The current waiting time for a flexible cystoscopy is 2 weeks and only a maximum of 8 procedures can be completed in one half day list. While the reasons for these are multifactorial, a large contributing factor is the time taken to complete a cystoscopy. With a successful bid, UDU could increase its current endoscopy capacity, offering more procedures and potentially run 2 simultaneous list. The location for this is already available in UDU at YGC.
- Although financial benefits will not be cash releasing, the estimated decrease in number of theatre lists for cystoscopies needed is 34 per annum (based on 126 procedures per year at a saving of an hour each), which will reduced the reliance on WLI sessions to achieve RTT waiting times

Donation of £75,300 for Awyr Las Fund 8B66 from the Flora and Robert Livsey Trust Fund, Registered Charity Number 1122389

The Flora and Robert Livsey Trust Fund came into being when Robert Livsey passed away. The couple's wish was to give back to the services that they had benefitted from during their lifetime so other patients could also receive excellent care. The Livseys specified that the money left in trust should support the following services in Ysbyty Glan Clwyd: urology, cardiology and vascular, cancer and stroke rehabilitation.

The Livsey Trust has previously given £1,106,880 through Awyr Las for: the new Cath Lab in YGC; an Ultrasound Machine with Probe for diagnosis in the Rapid Access Urology Clinic in YGC; and the Hybrid Theatre in YGC. On 28th February 2019 representatives from the Livsey Trust and the Health Board met and the Livsey Trust Trustees agreed to award further funding of £75,300.

The Flora and Robert Livsey Trust trustees have agreed to transfer the £75,300 on the agreement that it will be used to fund the following:

- a) **AngioJet Thrombectomy System.** This equipment is used in catheter-based procedures used for thrombolysis. The AngioJet Thrombectomy is used to break up a blood clot that is causing partial or full obstruction of blood flow in an artery. The £42,000 donation will fund one new console and a care package including 5 catheters.
- b) **Doppler Ultrasounds.** A Doppler ultrasound is a test that uses high-frequency sound waves to measure the amount of blood flow through your arteries and veins, to help detect abnormal flow within an artery or blood vessel. This can help to diagnose and treat a variety of conditions, including blood clots and poor circulation. The £9,300 donation will fund three new machines and laptops to support it.
- c) **Dermatome machine.** This is a surgical instrument used to produce thin slices of skin from a donor area. This machine will allow vascular surgeons to perform skin grafts for vascular patients in Glan Clwyd Hospital. The £24,000 donation will fund this new machine.

A Memorandum of Understanding outlining the details of the donation has been drawn up for the Trustees of the Livsey Trust. The 8B66 Fund Advisor, Jo Garzoni, who is the BCUHB Vascular Network Manager, confirmed that the running costs for the above equipment will be funded through NHS core funds in advance of submitting the requests for funding to the Livsey Trust.

The Fund Advisors for Fund 8B66 request that the Charity Advisory Group and Charity Committee give authorisation for the funds received from the Livsey Trust be used for the above purposes.

<p>Patients with suspected lung cancer currently receive a high standard of care, but there are a number of deficiencies and inefficiencies within the current diagnostic and treatment pathway. Specific problems in BCU, all of which are subject to national monitoring and reporting via the lung cancer standards,</p>		

relate to:

- Lack of capacity to undertake CT guided lung biopsy
- Referral to Liverpool heart and chest hospital for complex CT guided biopsies which incurs cost and delay
- Difficulty in obtaining definitive pathological diagnosis in a specific patient group with tumours relatively inaccessible to conventional biopsy techniques including CT guided biopsy
- Overall low lung cancer resection rates across North Wales, but particularly in Glan Clwyd hospital

Access to Electronavigational bronchoscopy (ENB), a new technology, would help us to address these issues, improve patient care and lung cancer performance against national targets. ENB uses new technology to create a 3D map of the lungs and guides the physician to the area of the lung where the tumour is located to take a sample. It can reach tumours that cannot be reached by traditional bronchoscopy, biopsy lesions only accessible via CT guided biopsy and lesions CT guided biopsy, in our centre is potentially unable to sample. It therefore has the potential to improve patient care and speed up the patient pathway

ENB also has a potential role in the assessment of small nodules in the lungs which are classified as indeterminate pulmonary nodules. Patients with small nodules in their lungs, often found incidentally or during staging CT's for non thoracic cancer, are referred to respiratory medicine for further assessment. In these circumstances the nodules are frequently small, and cannot be easily sampled by any existing biopsy technique. There are tools to work out the risk of cancer within the lung, but we are unable to provide certainty. This usually leads to a prolonged period of surveillance using CT scanning (the usual follow up is between 2 and 4 years when no known extrathoracic cancer is present), waiting to see if the nodule grows suggesting a primary cancer or metastases. This can be a very anxious time for patients, and leads to uncertainty for oncologists as to whether to offer further treatment or not. ENB could potentially increase the number of cases where we can biopsy the nodule rather than perform CT follow up and thereby reduce anxiety, the need to follow up and guide clinicians when making treatment decisions.

ENB is an increasingly established technique across Europe and the rest of the world. It is safe and reliable with good clinical data to support its use. It has been underutilized in the UK, partly because of the current diagnostic pathways, and partly because of the commissioning structure within NHS England.

What is the demand for this procedure A conservative assessment is 1 -2 cases per week across BCU when introduced

Who will it serve? – This service can be offered to all appropriate patients within BCUHB, and will apply to patients with suspected lung cancer, as well as



patients with known tumours arising elsewhere in the body (e.g. breast, colon, skin, upper GI tract) in whom there is concern the disease may have spread to the lung.

How will this service be introduced? - We are currently undergoing a trial of 15 cases funded by Awyr Las, assessing the feasibility of running an ENB service within the trust. Medtronic have provided training for 2 consultants (Dr Menzies and myself) and are supervising the cases.

Two cases have been performed so far. The first patient had radiological changes consistent with re-occurrence of lung Cancer. Oncology had requested histology to confirm this and standard bronchoscopy was non diagnostic. CT guided biopsy was technically possible but would potentially lead to a delay due to resources. We performed ENB within 1 week of oncology requesting a repeat procedure and obtained histology confirming re-occurrence.

Our second case was a biopsy of a 12mm lesion in apical segment of the left lower lobe. A PET scan had given the lesion a 24% risk of being cancer. National guidelines recommend in this case counseling the patient for CT follow up, biopsy or surgical resection. As in many cases involving lesions this size, the lesion was inaccessible to biopsy via CT or standard bronchoscopy and therefore prior to this trial only two of the options could have been offered. The procedure has demonstrated fibrotic/scar tissue on biopsy. We feel this is representative but are following up with CT to confirm benign pathology.

These cases have already demonstrated how the technology can reduce the time it takes for us to confirm a diagnoses and improve our ability to assess patients with indeterminate findings where there is a possibility of malignancy.

Charity Budget for 2019/20

1.0 Introduction

The Charity's budget for 2019/20 covers the costs of running the Charity, including administration, governance and fundraising.

2.0 Costs

All staff who work with the Charity are employed by the Health Board. The costs of the Fundraising Team are recharged in full to the Charity on a monthly basis. The costs of Finance staff involved in the charity are included within a monthly recharge from the Health Board, which is set at £96,000 per year. This charge also includes an element of overheads.

The Charity's non-pay costs predominantly relate to fundraising. These are split into costs incurred as part of the Fundraising Team's activities and other fundraising costs not initiated by the Team, which also includes costs incurred as part of a specific appeal.

3.0 Proposed Budget

The table below details the Charity's forecast administration, governance and fundraising costs for 2018/19, compared to the agreed budget and the proposed budgeted costs for 2019/20.

The total proposed budget for 2019/20 has been kept at the same level as the 2018/19 budget, although there have been some small movements between categories to take account of increased pay costs.

Points to note:

- Fundraising Staff Costs are projected to increase due to the NHS pay award and incremental drift. The forecast over spend for 2018/19 relates to cover for long-term sickness.
- Fundraising Team non-pay costs are forecast to be under budget in 2018/19 due to staffing issues in the team reducing their capacity to support projects. Costs are expected to rise in 2019/20 as the team becomes fully operational.
- Other Fundraising Costs; fundraising events that sit outside of the Fundraising Team are expected to increase in 2019/20 as the team work with Fund Advisors and Charity Champions to help them develop local events. However the budget has been reduced due to the large under spend forecast for 2018/19.

4.0 Allocation of Costs

As previously agreed by the Committee, all of the administration, governance and central fundraising costs for the Charity are charged to General Funds. General Funds receives all of the gains or losses on the investments plus the investment income and this is therefore used to pay for the Charity's costs. Additionally, when funds allow, the remainder can be used to support Health Board initiatives.

Other Fundraising Costs are charged to the fund that will benefit from that fundraising and so are not charged to General Funds.

The total charge to General Funds for 2019/20 would be £437,000. General Funds at the 31st December 2018 totalled a deficit of £231,000, therefore the proposed budget would increase the deficit to £668,000, pending future investment gains and income.

5.0 Recommendations

The Committee are asked to approve the budget for 2019/20.
