Bringing you your monthly update on the improvement works at Ysbyty Gwynedd's ED



Construction work is progressing well at the Emergency Department with the team working hard completing the outside of the building and forming the new ambulance drop off area.

The team are now looking forward to seeing the removal of the canopy at the front of the building which will be removed before Christmas.

MEET THE ED TEAM

Dyma Pete Williams sy'n feddyg ymgynghorol mewn meddygaeth beadiatrig frys yn Adran Achosion Brys Ysbyty Gwynedd.

Yn ogystal â gweithio yn ein Hadran Achosion Brys, mae Pete hefyd yn gweithio'n rhan-amser i Dîm Meddygon sy'n Hedfan Cymru, gwasanaeth y GIG sy'n gweithio mewn partneriaeth ag Elusen Ambiwlans Awyr Cymru, o Faes Awyr Caernarfon.

Mae'r Adran Achosion Brys yn gweld rhyw 16,000 o blant y flwyddyn ac ar hyn o bryd, nid oes unrhyw ardal aros ar wahân ar eu cyfer.

Dyweddodd Pete, sydd wedi wynebu llawer o sefyllfaoedd gwahanol yn ei swydd, o ddelio â brathiadau gwiberod i drawma mawr: "Bydd y datblygiad newydd hwn o fudd i blant sy'n dod i'r Adran Achosion Brys, bydd yr adeilad newydd yn darparu ardal aros ar gyfer plant a fydd yn cynnig amgylchedd sydd â mwy o le ac sy'n fwy llachar a bydd hefyd yn ei wneud yn brofiad llai trawmatig pan fyddan nhw'n ymweld â'r Adran Achosion Brys. Rydym i gyd yn edrych ymlaen yn fawr at weld y gwaith yn cael ei gwblhau."

Meet Pete Williams who is a consultant in paediatric emergency medicine at Ysbyty Gwynedd's Emergency Department.

As well as working at our ED Pete also works part time for the Welsh Flying Medics Team, an NHS service that works in partnership with the Wales Air Ambulance Charity, from Caernarfon Airport.

The Emergency Department sees around 16,000 children a year and there is currently no separate waiting area for them.

Pete, who has faced many scenarios in his job, from dealing with adder bites to major trauma, said: "This new development is going to benefit children coming into the ED, the new build will provide a separate waiting area for children which will provide a more spacious and bright environment and will also make it a less traumatic experience for them visiting the ED. We are all very much looking forward to seeing the work completed."

Maen nhw yn y broses o greu'r ardal ollwng newydd i ambiwlansys a fydd yn helpu i wella profiad y cleifion.



Despite a number of challenges, which are not uncommon with a project of this nature the team has worked to overcome these and this first phase of the new development is scheduled for completion in mid-February.




